- 1. Looking back on the past week, share the most memorable engaging the lost experience.
- 2. What was the first thing the Samaritan woman did when she met Jesus? (w. 28-29). Considering the woman's situation, what hardships did she need to overcome before she went to people and talked about Jesus? What is the reason she was able to overcome all those hardships and boldly share Jesus? Do you have a water jar in your life that you need to put down in order to share the Jesus we met with others?
- 3. How do the Samaritans react to the woman's confession? (verses 30, 39, 42). Because of the woman's sincere confession, many people came to Jesus, believed Him, and their souls were saved. It shows how the gospel of life spreads. Through whom did you meet Jesus? If you know someone who met Jesus through you or you're currently trying to share the gospel with someone, please share with your group.
- 4. Jesus said, "My food is to do the will of Him who sent me and to accomplish His work". Finding the lost souls that God is looking for and leading them to salvation are the very reason Jesus lived and is accomplishing God's will. Please pray that engaging the lost can become a part of our daily life, like the food we eat for our soul every day. If we faithfully share the gospel, God will save the lost souls with His love and grace.
